TOP 1

Adoption of the Protocol 1994/2 (Meeting of the Board in Zürich, Nov. 28, 1994)

The protocol is adopted with one alteration in TOP 10:

P. Lincoln reports that a quality control exercise for paternity testing is organised each year by the English Speaking Working Group of the Society and this summer 20 laboratories throughout Europe took part, not only English Speaking group members. The group at their General Assembly in Venice agreed that a request should be made to the Board of the Society for them to consider the possibility of the Society providing any financial support for this venture. Such a support is not given by the Board.

TOP 2

Business of the President

W. Bär reports that he had some contacts with the HUGO/Human Diversity project; in principle, there are no clear-cut agreements between HUGO and the ISFH with regard to a possible cooperation.

He informs the Board that a French Speaking Working Party has been founded by Mangin and that he had some positive contacts with the German Finanzamt in order to keep the exemption from taxes for the ISFH.

TOP 3

Business of the Secretary

Several new members are admitted (Annex 1). The invitation for the General Assembly in Santiago de Compostela is discussed; furthermore, the Board decides to keep english and german as official languages of the ISFH.

TOP 4

Business of the other Members of the Board

- B. Brinkmann reports that he will try with the help of the Springer Verlag to include "Advances in Forensic Haemogenetics" in "Current Contents".
- P. Lincoln presents the financial report (see Annex 2). The membership fee will be increased to DM 50,- as the price for the Proceedings of the Congress amounts to DM 80,-. With regard to the 15th International Congress in Venice, there is no information from U. Rossi (he spoke with W.R. Mayr on July 9, 1995 and promised to send a report within the next 2 months).
- A. Carracedo reports that he will coordinate the activities of the Working Parties. He will try to get the programmes of meetings in due time so that they can be included in the Newsletters of the ISFH.
